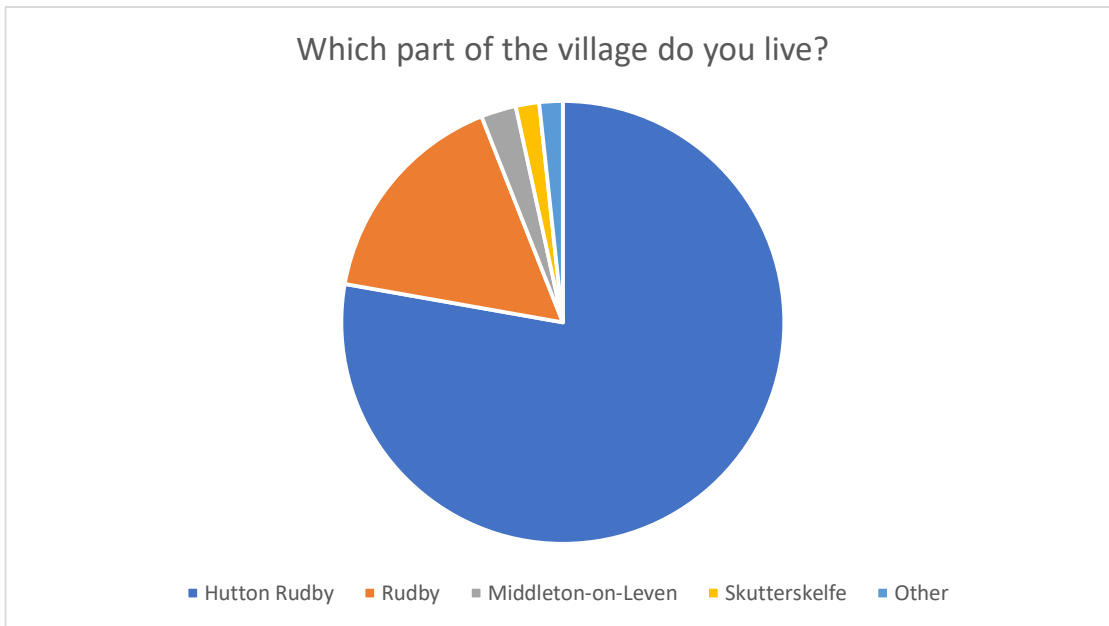

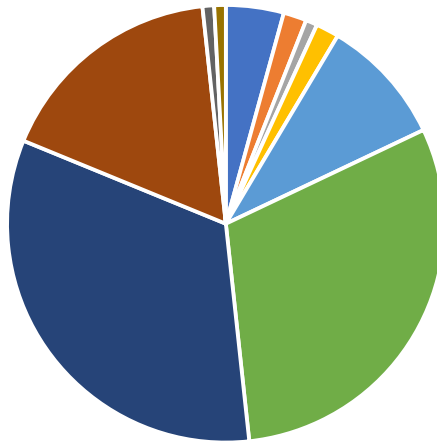

Age Profile

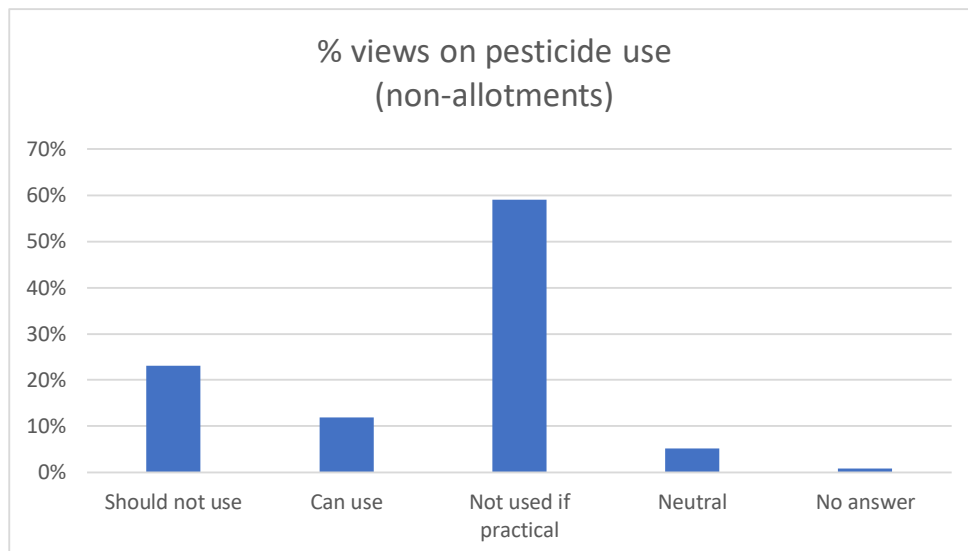

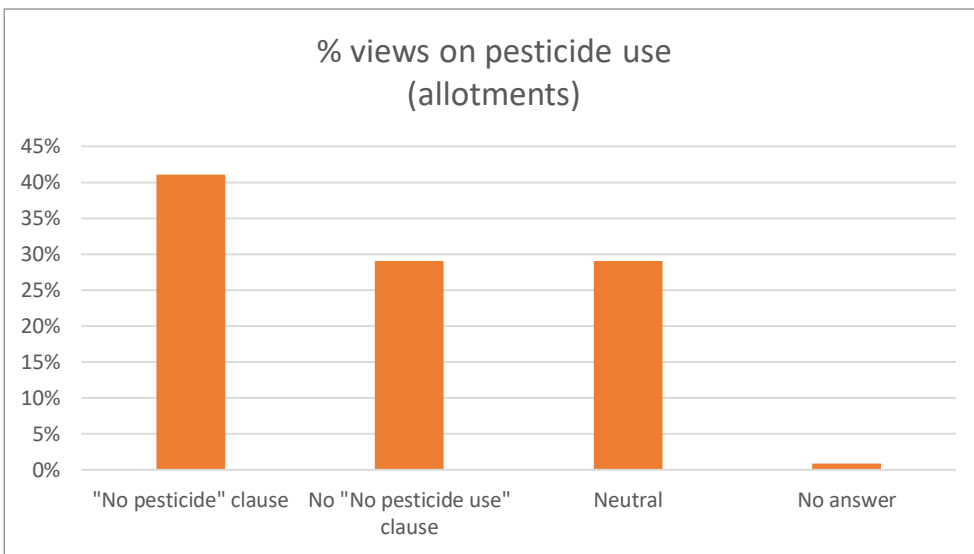

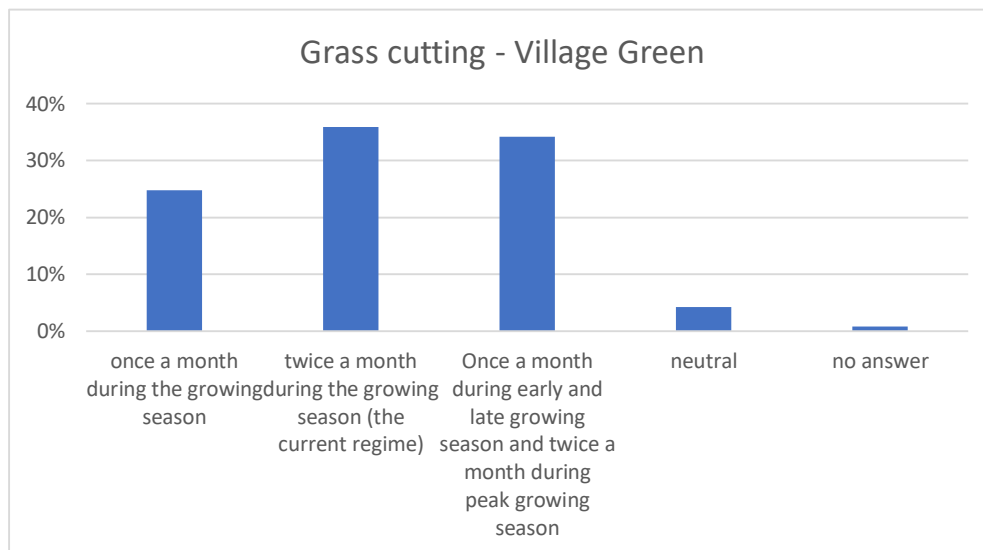

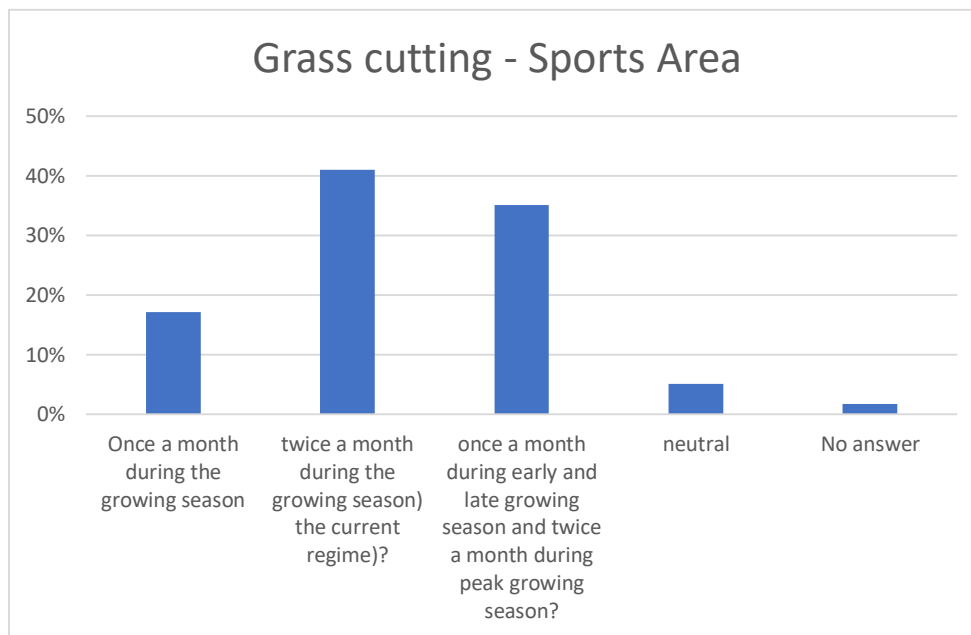

How often would you wish the Sports Area grass to be cut?

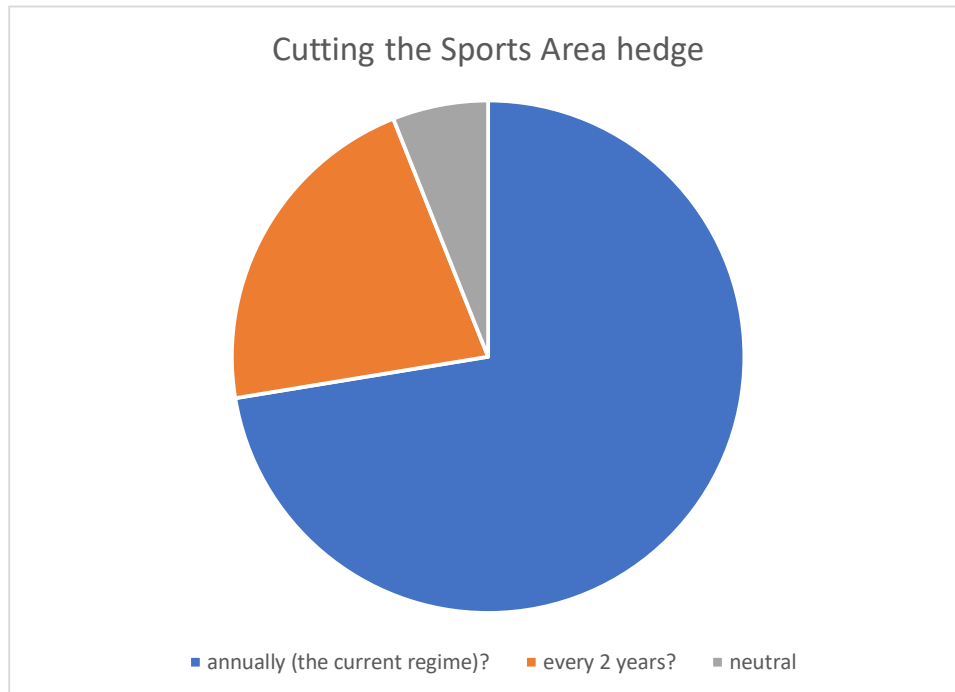

The hedge surrounding the Sports Area is cut annually. How often would you prefer to see it cut?

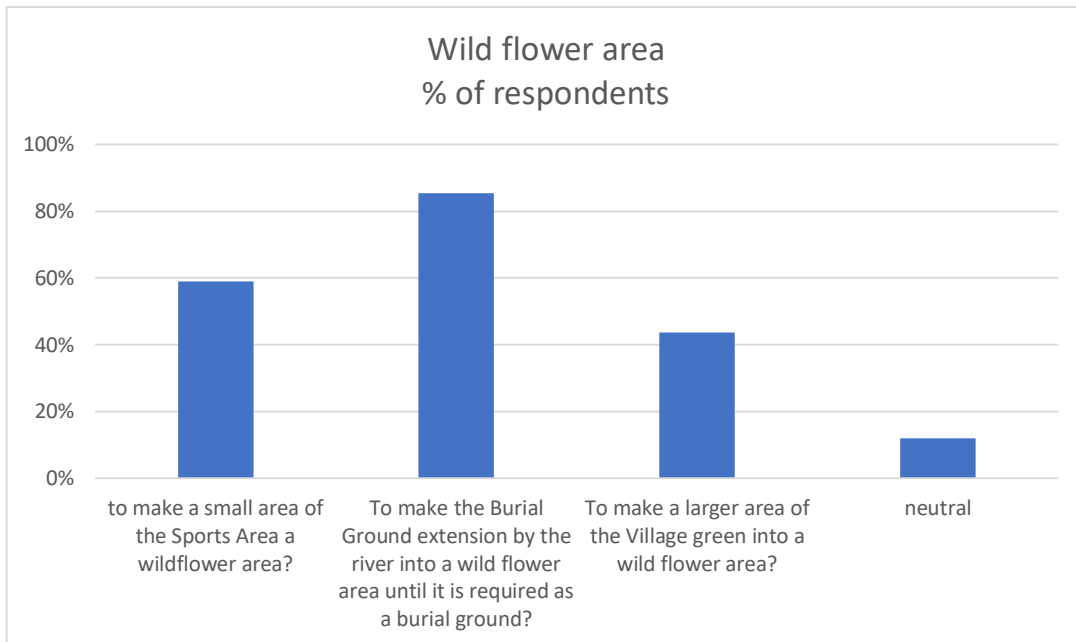

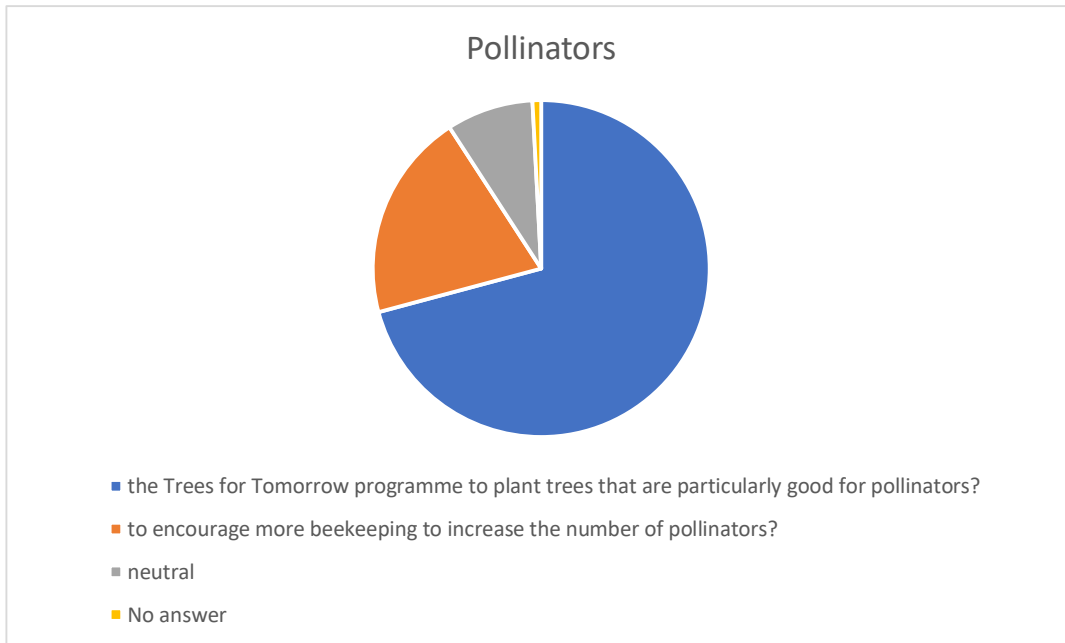
